Gentlemen:

Referring to your letter of the 8th inst., trans-
mitting application of Wm. A. Cunningham for return of \$1.25
per acre, paid on the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$, SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$, and SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$,
sec. 25, Tp. 5 S., R. 15 E., cash entry No. 513, you are ad-
vised that the act of June 16, 1880, only provides for return
of \$1.25 per acre in cases where parties have paid \$2.50 per
acre for lands subsequent to the passage of the act of March
2, 1889, for lands reduced by said act.

The land embraced in said entry No. 513, was within
the limits of the grant to the Texas Pacific Railroad.

The lands formerly within the limits of said road
were reduced to \$1.25 per acre by the act of March 2, 1889.
Hence, when Cunningham made said entry, he paid the regular
price per acre of \$2.50, and there can be no return of any
portion of the purchase money.
